was established through federal, state, and county funding. To date, FOFR has hosted over 30,000 students from southern Wisconsin downstream to Yorkville, for no charge.



In 2016 FOFR entered into an agreement with the City of Aurora to expand our educational services, and establish the Aurora "Watershed Watchdog" program. Currently, we are working with City of Crystal Lake in effort to maintain that well-established program.

These Watershed Watchdogs as citizen scientists are more than just data collectors. Their connection to their local stream and understanding of the impacts of human actions make them appropriate stewards. They are the protectors of water quality today and the decision makers of tomorrow. At Friends of the Fox River, we work on many fronts to protect the watershed's resources. It is the Watershed Watchdog program that we invest the heaviest in, as we know that it is effective and will have long lasting impacts.

This year's film is "Hometown Habitat Stories of Bringing Nature Home" featuring Doug Tallamy and directed by Catherine Zimmerman, who will be present for the screening.




Phil explains:

"The picture was taken with a Canon EOS digital SLR camera. I love walking and riding my bike along the Fox River and watching the different types of wildlife. The white egret in the photo seemed to be posing at the Batavia dam. I took the picture towards the sun which darkened the background and caused the camera to quicken the shutter speed which caused the water to look "globby." I have to admit that the picture turned out better than I thought it would and has become one of my favorite photos."

Hope notes:

"This photo was taken from the bridge across the Fox River at sunrise. I think it shows how the river and people are intertwined, through the water, the bridge across it, and our desire to settle by water, with the lights from the buildings reflected in it. I use my phone camera when I take pictures.

I take pictures because I like the way the sun looks on other objects and all the different perspectives you can have. The way you can make someone feel something, just by taking a picture, is intriguing to me."
